**Present:** Chairman Daniel “Dan” Worley, Vice-Chairman Larry Dost, Supervisor Woody Myers, Solicitor Guy Beneventano, Secretary Valena Garlin, and visitors listed on the attendance sheet.

Chairman Worley opened the Regular Meeting at 6:00 P.M. and led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Chairman Worley made a motion 1) to approve the Minutes from the August 12, 2013 meeting and 2) to approve the Treasurer's Report of August 31, 2013. The motion was seconded by Woody Myers and carried unanimously.

**POLICE REPORT –**

Chief Mike Weigand gave the following report for August 12 – September 7, 2013: there were 105 calls for service, 4,040 miles patrolled and 233.5 duty hours logged. There were 16 traffic citations and 17 warnings. The Department participated in two (2) DUI Checkpoints, four (4) U.S. Marshal Details .

There was a good turnout for National Night Out.

The Neighborhood Crime Watch meeting for August had been cancelled. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 24, 2013 at 7:00 P.M. in the Latimore Township Building.

There is a Drug Take Back scheduled for October 26, 2013 from 10 am to 2 pm at Bermudian Springs School District.

The police department received a grant for teen seat belt enforcement. Chief Weigand said the national average for non use of seat belts is 10 percent. It is a primary offense for anyone under the age of 18 not to wear a seat belt.

Chief Weigand stated there has been an accumulation of trash at the closed Shell station. He believes that travelers who do not know the station is closed are stopping for gas and they are leaving their trash in front of the building where the garbage cans are. Solicitor Beneventano stated if the police see activity there, they should stop and ask who they are and what they are doing there. If there are vehicles parked there, the police should get their license plate numbers. Singh and his wife are still listed as the primary owners. The property is in foreclosure. The Bank that has the first mortgage on the property cannot find Mr. Singh to serve him the complaint.

The Bank has gone to get a court order to publish the notice in the newspaper. The Singhs have 20 days to answer the complaint. Mr. Singh is also facing criminal charges for the alleged contamination he committed on the property. The solicitor stated Mr. Singh has done everything possible to evade the law. There are judgments from the Court awarding the township attorney fees. The judgment is a lien on the property. The lien stays with the property.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT (2)**

Brian Brandt from Lake Meade Fire Company asked the supervisors if they would be interested in joining the Adams County Council of Governments (ACCOG) also known as the Adams COG. The COG has been looking into municipalities adopting a fire tax. Dan Worley told Mr. Brandt the township has a contribution to send to Lake Meade Fire Company and Ambulance. Mr. Brandt stated a couple months ago the treasurer died and they have been trying to get the paperwork and find a new treasurer. Dan Worley reported that a couple years back a summary was prepared listing the municipal contributions to the fire companies in Adams County. Latimore Township is contributing more to their fire companies than most of the other municipalities. Latimore ranks higher than about 90 percent of the other municipalities. Dan Worley stated the township's main fire company, York Springs, does not want a fire tax. There was also a discussion on the box cards and the fire companies working together. Mr. Brandt stated there are not too many fire companies in Adams County. The supervisors will look over the information from the COG.
