Regular Meeting
September 17, 2019; 6:00 PM

Present: Chairman Dan Worley, Vice-Chairman Larry Dost, Supervisor Woody Myers, Chief Michael Weigand, Secretary Jennie Gordon. 7 Visitors.

Chairman Dan Worley called the regular meeting to order at 6:00 PM and led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Dan Worley made a motion to approve the minutes of August 12, 2019. He also motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report of August 31, 2019. Larry Dost seconded, and motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Larry Banzhoff inquired about taking his one lot and returning it to the original plan of 3 lots that were created at the time of development. Township Solicitor Guy Beneventano responded to Mr. Banzhoff stating that a formal subdivision would be required as it has already been merged to one lot. John Shambaugh answered his questions about the requirements that needed to be followed. Mr. Beneventano suggested that he seek the advisement of his counsel.

REPORTS

Police Report: Chief Michael Weigand reported for 8/11/19-9/6/19 that there were 217 calls for service, 2,643 miles patrolled, 16 traffic citations, 32 warnings, 0 non-traffic citation and 2 criminal arrest. He reported that the next National Drug Take Back will be held October, 26, 2019 at the Bermudian Springs High School from 10 AM-2PM. The Spring event was the highest collection amount and was very successful. He said that Latimore's collection site was the 2nd or 3rd highest of 8 sites in the county. Chief Weigand responded to a visitor's question as to whether or not they accept sharpies at the site. He responded that they do **not** accept sharpies at the site. He said to check with local drugstores. He answered Dan Worley's question as to whether the drugs are incinerated. Chief Weigand reported that they are incinerated after they are turned over to the D.E.A.

Engineer's Report: None

Road Report: Woody Myers reported that they are currently getting the trucks inspected and that plows are already on some of the trucks. Dan Worley noted that Larry Dost has been doing a lot of mowing.

Park Report: Woody Myers reported that currently the Bermudian Springs Soccer Club is using fields.

OLD BUSINESS: None

NEW BUSINESS:

1. John Shambaugh reported that the Planning Commission has approved the Waivers and Plan of the Faus/Trostle Subdivision. Dan Worley motioned to approve the Trostle/Faus Waivers and Subdivision Plan. Woody Myers Seconded. Motion carried.

2. Dan Worley motioned approved the Faus Waivers and Faus Subdivision. Woody Myers seconded. Motion carried.

3. Larry Dost motioned to reject the Final Land Development Plan for Kenneth and Suzanne Eberly due to material planning deficiencies. Woody Myers seconded. Motion carried.

4. Proposed Zoning Ordinance Amendments: At the request of the Planning Board, the Township Supervisors have prepared certain proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance and sent the proposed amendments to the Adams County Office of Planning and Development for review and comment. If adopted, the proposed amendments will delete kennels, animal hospitals, stables and riding academies from the Township's R-A zoning district, and add animal hospitals, stables and riding academies to the list of supplemental uses within the R-A District.

5. No salt bids were received.

BILLS LIST

Larry Dost reported that he had reviewed the bills list and recommended that it be approved as submitted. Woody Myers seconded, and motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT (2)

Tom Eyler, representing the York Springs Fire Co., announced that the township should be receiving the EMS contract shortly. He said that the fire company is becoming "people poor" with fundraising events. He said it is getting harder all the time. He reported that Jane Boserman has become the Business Manager and will deal with questions from the public. He said that Maryland had a very good vocational program that worked well with the fire companies but it is not as easy to work with the Pennsylvania school districts. He also stated that after 9/11, it was easier to get federal grant money. He said it has become increasingly difficult over the last years.

SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

1. Larry Dost motioned to reissue salt bids. Woody Myers seconded. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT

Dan Worley made a motion to adjourn, and Woody Myers seconded. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 6:26 PM.
